

## A magical mix of independent shops...

Quirky streets and famous landmarks combine with medieval architecture and ancient battle sites, all within walking distance, to offer a shopping experience that's second to none.

Lined with picturesque black and white timber frame buildings, New Street is typical of Worcester's streets, combining old with new and offering a great mix of shops, pubs and restaurants. A green arch leads to the picturesque Reindeer Court, a former coaching inn, with a host of independent outlets, while The Shambles houses one of the oldest shopping precincts in the city, and The Gallery, once The Market Hall, is now a vibrant shopping arcade on two tiers, housing many independent outlets.

Friar Street is one of Worcester's most historic and picturesque shopping streets, home to Greyfriars' House and Garden, Tudor House and Worcester's oldest pub, The Cardinal's Hat; and a short walk down the High Street takes you to Cathedral Plaza, opposite the world-famous Cathedral and Elgar's statue.
