



The Commandery is a unique Grade I listed site, dating back to the 13th century. A fascinating mix of historical architecture and social history combine to bring this building's colourful past to life. Over the centuries The Commandery has had many roles including a mediaeval monastic hospital, but it is most famous for its role as the Royalist Headquarters during the Battle of Worcester – the deciding battle of the English Civil War.



Explore historic rooms, discover fascinating stories and enjoy charming, peaceful gardens in the heart of historic Worcester.
